The Burn Ban is ON

The burn ban in Kendall County is **ON!** As of June 26, 2017, the Kendall County Commissioners have reinstated the burn ban, so there is no burning in Kendall County. We ask that you call Boerne dispatch at 830-249-8645 to report anyone burning. The expectation is for a dry summer and an increased potential for grass fires later in the summer. Be careful to protect yourselves and your property.

July Department Report

The Bergheim VFD has 21 active members, and all seven vehicles are in service. As of end July, the Department has responded to 146 service calls, a 45% increase over 2016.
